## Master Warrant Officer Carl Larouche, CD

On 10 November 2017, MWO Carl Larouche will retire with over 30 years of dedicated service to both the Canadian Armed Forces and the Corps of RCEME. MWO Larouche joined the CF as a Fire Control Systems technician (FCS) on 27 August 1987, completing his basic training and electronics course at CFB St-Jean in November 1988. He completed the TQ3 at the Canadian Forces School of Electrical Mechanical Engineering at CFB Borden, and then moved to 202 Workshop DA in Montreal.

His assignments were as follows; 202 Workshop Depot in Montreal in 1990, 5 SVC BN from 1991 to 1998, 3 R22R from 1998 to December 1999, 12 RBC from December 1999 to June 2004, instructor Electro-Optical (EO) and Sgt EO standards to the Electrical Mechanical Engineering School of the Canadian Forces (CFSEME) in Borden from 2004 to 2010, DGLEPM of March 2010 to October 2011, Canadian Operational Support Command from October 2011 to October 2012 & Canadian Joint Operations Command since October 5, 2012. He has been involved in three missions in 1994 with the United Nations Protection Force in Bosnia, in 2000 with the International Force East Timor and in 2002 with the NATO mission in Bosnia (SFOR). He has held positions as administrative assistant to the CWO of DGLEPM, RCEME and the Canadian Joint Operations Command (CJOC) in Ottawa. He has held the position of Manager of Life Cycle Materiel Management (LCMM) and technical authority (TAC) of the Chemical Agent Warfare sensors.

He is married to Anne Landry, currently serving as a Public servant in Ottawa where they both plan to retire.
