d. <u>Cross-Country Bike Relay</u> – public funding is not available for this activity. In order to assist the national and regional teams, fundraising activities will take place for the \$30,000.00 required to support this event. Canvassing of interest/continued participation for this event will take place in the next few weeks;

**SECRETARIAL NOTE:** After further consideration, it has been decided that the Cross-Country Bike Relay will not take place as an activity in the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebrations.

- e. <u>Skill at Arms</u> this exercise will be held at the RCEME School in May 2019 with teams attending from across the country (including CFB Borden); and
- f. Nijmegen in addition to the national team (National Capital Region), the 75th Anniversary Committee will approach the Army, Navy and Air Force to request that RCEME personnel be included as members of an additional team.
- 10. <u>Commemorative Products</u>. Colonel Dundon provided an update on the progress of the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary product development:

- a. <u>Video "A Soldier's Story"</u> while there is no current update available, the interviews from Borden have been completed, messages from the regional network have been compiled from across the country and the collection of filming of different activities across the Corps has begun;
- b. <u>"A Week in the Life of RCEME" photobook</u> this book will consist of seven chapters, each representing a day of the week in the life of RCEME, with respect to the various projects and activities in each area. 1,500 books will be delivered in 2018, with distribution beginning in January 2019. A second printing of books will be available through <a href="https://www.amazon.ca/">https://www.amazon.ca/</a> and at bookstores across the country;
- c. 75th Anniversary coin a polygon-shaped coin with enamel has been developed. Distribution of coins (in lieu of the annual anniversary pins) will be funded by the RCEME Corps Fund and will also be available at CANEX;
- d. RCEME 75th Anniversary Glen Fiddich Scotch the company will produce a label with the 75th anniversary theme and the company will also assist with distribution by sending the bottles to their provincial depots. Corps Fund representatives will order, pick up and distribute bottles. There is no minimum order, however, Glen Fiddich has requested up to three orders of product. Payment options are being investigated;

SECRETARIAL NOTE: It was confirmed that it would be a 15 year old product.

RCEME Corps Foundation - there remains a strong commitment to the development of a RCEME Corps Foundation, consisting entirely of retirees in order to keep corporate fundraising separate from the Corps. This increased visibility could be enhanced if the LADs were involved in initiating and communicating local fundraising activities. SECRETARIAL NOTE. Chief Warrant Officer (Retired) Rest motioned that the fundraising report be accepted as presented, seconded by Warrant Officer Peters. Corps Jiffy Jeeps. A brief history was presented on subject. Jiffy Jeeps have Administrative provided skilled (disassembly and assembly in 90 seconds or less) demonstrations Committee Chairman/Corps across Canada. There are two jeeps - one held in Edmonton and the other currently residing in Borden which is being refurbished at Base Maintenance. While the jeep Sergeant-Major is an excellent Corps promotional tool and a valuable asset, they also come with costs and liabilities such as team t-shirts, insurance, maintenance etc. Liability insurance remains a concern in the event of an accident to either the participants or the onlookers, especially if the event is off base. SECRETARIAL NOTE. Lieutenant-Colonel Spitzig will investigate the cost of obtaining more jeeps so that each region has one, and Chief Warrant Officer Walhin will consult with the Judge Advocate General's office with respect to liability insurance. Both will report at the fall Board of Directors meeting. Fundraising Campaign Slogan Selection. The slogan "Building a Future Fundraising 15. Together" was chosen from the 22 that were submitted. The corresponding French Chairman/ translation must convey the same meaning of the slogan. Lieutenant-Colonel Spitzig Administrative motioned that the slogan, with the appropriate French translation be adopted, Committee seconded by Chief Warrant Officer Walhin. All in favour - motion carried. SECRETARIAL NOTE: The Corps Adjutant and the Administrative Committee will ensure that the translation properly reflects the fundraising slogan. CANEX/RCEME Items. Chief Warrant Officer Saunders provided Training information on new products that will soon be available at the CANEX such as Systems window decals and track suits. He also spoke to other items that did not generate Representative much interest, such as women's scarves and brooches. Canvassing for ideas for additional new products is ongoing from local Craftsmen and on "Facebook". LAD Benefits. Chief Warrant Officer (Retired) Rest began his presentation Deputy Chairman on the benefits of becoming a LAD, citing the national website as an excellent means for retirees to remain connected to the Corps. As a LAD member, there is an ability to have input to the Corps Fund directly and facilitates the option of continuing their membership for those members who are retiring or releasing. LADs have the ability to support local units with funding for bonspiels, etc. This also has the added benefit of bringing both serving and retired members together. Corps Adjutant Website. The website requires updating so that the "join" and "donation" features can be executed. It was proposed by the Administrative Committee that Pixelera will be responsible for the design update, development of a bilingual website content, importation of the old material to the new site all for a one time cost of not to

exceed \$5,000.00. There is an ongoing annual website fee of \$1,000.00 for hosting, support and maintenance fee. Chief Warrant Officer (Retired) Rest proposed that approval in principle be granted for these costs, seconded by Colonel McKenzie.  SECRETARIAL NOTE. The combined reoccurring fee for Pixelera/Member 365 and the website is \$3,400.00 per year or \$283 per month. The Statement of Work will be circulated to the Board of Directors for final review.	
19. <u>Museum Update</u> . Colonel (Retired) Temple provided a review of the museum's Phase I activity with the various displays and historical phases of RCEME presented which is 99% complete. The Phase II museum is a 10,000 square foot standalone museum. The concept and costs of a virtual museum is being considered. There remains a financial challenge with Phase II in that MDN construction funding has decreased from last year and this may impact progress. Director of History and Heritage will also not be providing any funds this year.	Co-Chairman RCEME Museum
20. Round Table. Captain Dzeoba responded to a question posed by one of the attending craftsmen about the possibility of paying the annual membership dues of a retiree. A suggestion was made that a "Donation" button be added to the RCEME Corps Fund website unique for this purpose. An update will be provided at the fall Board of Directors meeting.	
21. Both the Colonel Commandant and the Corps Sergeant-Major thanked everyone for attending. Director RCEME also thanked everyone for participating and for their continuing work on behalf of the RCEME Corps Fund.
