OPENING ADDRESS

- 1. The Chairman of the RCEME Guild, Colonel Corriveau asked that outstations start the meeting by introducing themselves and he then welcomed all to the meeting. He continued by stating that the intent of the meeting is to have serving and retired members strengthen and preserve the bonds of comradeship born of their common experiences as Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) maintainers while preserving Corps culture. He also noted that the upcoming 75th Anniversary is a key marker for the CAF, the Corps and the Guild.
- 2. The Deputy Chairman, Chief Warrant Officer (Retired) Art Rest, stressed that this is an organization that spreads across the country and as such, all decisions and actions cannot be solely made at the BOD meeting level. Members in the field, including junior ranks, are encouraged to voice their opinions and concerns, and if there are any questions to be asked, they will be answered to the best of the BOD's ability.

Brigadier-General (Retired) Brewer recommended that the RCEME Guild BOD establish a sub-committee to examine this issue. This report should examine whether lifetime memberships are implemented, who would be the OPI, what would the management process be and what would the criteria be for becoming a lifetime member. Note, the number of lifetime memberships that will be permitted to be issued in one year will require discussion.	
19. RCEME 75 th Anniversary Update. The 75 th Anniversary is not just a RCEME celebration, but is more Canada's celebration of its pride in its' Army and Canadian RCEME Corps. As activities are promoted, it is important to include all Canadians so that they get to know the RCEME Corps and its' accomplishments over the past 75 years. Colonel Matsalla provided an outline of Commemorative Products, National Activities, Regional Activities and Communications with the review of the budget.	75th Anniversary Chairman
20. By 10 September 2018, Colonel Matsalla will ask regions to provide a back brief of their activities, venues for RCEME activities and expected costs and resources, such as VIPs, Jiffy Jeeps, etc. that will be needed. Regions will also be asked to provide a plan on how they will incorporate Commemorative Products and National Activities in their region. The attached Annexes E and F provide information regarding these products and events, a timeline and a listing of events and venues where they may take place as well as deadlines.	
21. <u>Communications</u> . The 75 th Anniversary pamphlet (Annex G) should be well known to everyone in the Corps. The RCEME Website and 75 th Anniversary Facebook page weekly update continue to focus on this project. The committee continues to reach out to the other CAF communities and to sponsors. The RCEME Journal Special Edition, the t-shirt and the coffee table book will all allow sponsors to show their own name/logo on various products. Care was taken in preparing a design presentation (advertising space, size of logo, resolution, number of colours permitted, etc.) which has been made available to each sponsor.	
22. 75 th Anniversary Budget. The BOD approved an expenditure of \$5,000.00 to fund the production of a 75 th Anniversary video and 60 second clip on 26 February 2014. These funds have been committed to this project. During a briefing to the BOD on 15 September 2017Col Matsalla asked that an additional amount not to exceed \$42,000.00 be authorized for the 75 th Anniversary celebration in the event of a funding shortfall. His request was approved by the BOD. As previously discussed, the amount required to fully fund the remaining projects is \$55,000.00. The total amount of the donations collected for the 75 Anniversary (as of 08 August 2018) is \$32,000.00 which reduces the Guild commitment from \$42,000 to 223,000. This amount will continue to shrink as additional donations are submitted. After further discussion, it was decided that if more than \$55,000.00 is raised the excess funds will be used to reduce the retail price of the CANEX 75 th Anniversary t-shirts.	

23. <u>LAD Partnerships</u> . An email was sent to the regional network, requesting that partnerships be established with the local LADs. Members of these organizations are familiar with local industries and businesses and may be able to provide contacts for regional representatives. LAD members may also be interested in personally contributing as well. In their back brief, due the week of 10 September 2018, the regional network will inform the committee of its' progress regarding this partnership.	
24. Colonel Matsalla summarized his presentation, urging the Board to get RCEME Corps and RCEME Guild members involved with the 75 th Anniversary celebrations by way of commemorative products and national and regional activities. Fundraising should continue to be encouraged, however, Brigadier-General (Retired) Giguère is to be advised prior to anyone approaching industry contacts.	Chairman/ 75th Anniversary Chairman
25. <u>RCEME Museum Update.</u> Colonel (Retired) Temple provided some background on the video tour that was produced by students at Algonquin College in Ottawa. The 10 minute video is available on-line through YOUTUBE and is called "RCEME Museum Tour English" and "RCEME Museum Tour French."	Co-Chair RCEME Museum
26. Advertising efforts are being coordinated with the Communications and Electronics Branch for pamphlets that would be made available in gas stations and highway motels. Guides are available for museum tours with a 1 - 2 hour notice.	
27. <u>Displays</u> . Ninety-eight percent of the displays have been completed, with work continuing in the Honours and Awards section. Five officers and Non-Commissioned Members have been selected to represent the history of the Corps; WWI (pre-RCEME), WWII, Korea, Somalia and Afghanistan. There is room for 14 displays, however, this could change depending on the size of each display.	
28. The late Corporal Earl Hodges' drawings will be replicated to be used as colouring sheets for the museum's younger visitors.	
Financing. The Corps of RCEME presently owns 30% of the museum annex, which accounts for 15% of the space in the C&E Museum. Ninety percent of museum operating costs are paid by C&E and the RCEME Corps pays slightly more than its share based on floor space. This is due to the permanent staff on-sit that care for visitors and the day-to-day operations, etc. The museum committees for both RCEME and C&E will meet to discuss the 2019 budget. The budget will be presented at the October/November 2018 Heritage Committee meeting and in turn will be presented for approval at the spring 2019 RCEME Guild BOD meeting. As was suggested at the last BOD meeting, it is preferable for the museum to present a budget forecast for the next two years. Colonel (Retired) Temple did not anticipate an issue, barring any extraordinary charges that could impact the forecast, such as an increase in the Ontario minimum wage.	Co-Chairman RCEME Museum

30. Funds that are received from the Director of History and Heritage (DHH) are not targeted for operating costs, but rather for development costs for displays and location of desired artifacts. Changes with respect to safety are being made to the Leopard turret presently in the museum.	
31. Support to Cadets – Bursary Criteria. Before setting a criteria, interest in a bursary must first be solicited from the Cadet units. As this would be a bursary for a Cadet unit and not an individual, Captain Dzeoba feels that the criteria should include introduction and history of the Cadet unit and what type of youth programs are offered, i.e., leadership programs, Remembrance Day activities, etc. Colonel Corriveau suggested in the interest of clarity in the budget, that this item be given a separate line and called either an "award" or a "grant" rather than a bursary. The bursary amount would be \$500.	Corps Adjutant
32. Colonel Corriveau further proposed that an additional yet to be determined amount be placed as a line item in the budget which would provide support to Cadet units for accourtements, activities, etc. The amount can be fixed at the spring 2019 BOD meeting, along with the \$500 grant, both of which should be entered under "Benefits to Corps". 33. 2018 RCEME Bursary Campaign — Winners. A motion was passed at the previous BOD meeting that students who are being paid while attending post-secondary education will be not permitted to apply unless there were extraordinary circumstances associated with their education that would make them eligible. In this year's submissions, there was an application by an RMC student who wanted to purchase a laptop computer. It was decided that this application would be considered ineligible and was therefore removed from the approved applicants.	Corps Adjutant
34. Instructions on how to correctly submit an application for a RCEME bursary must be more stringent and it must be clearly stated that in order for the application to be accepted for consideration, the proper submission rules must be followed. The case of changing the evaluation criteria to access the perception of "need" was also raised, with the thought that the bursary marking guide should be changed to reflect this observation. 36. Round Table:	
a. Chief Warrant Officer (Retired) Devlin advised that he was approached on several occasions regarding the Honour Roll not being posted on the RCEME website as it was on the older RCEME Association site from Kingston. This older site has been discontinued, however, Chief Warrant Officer Ryder confirmed that the Honour Roll and photographs from the old site have been downloaded and kept to post on the new RCEME website. Captain Dzeoba will be contacted to liaise with the website coordinator;	

- Chief Warrant Officer (Retired) Devlin also raised the issue of the continued maintenance of the Honour Roll which is presently being administered by Padre Donald Chisholm. It is felt that this should also be a RCEME Guild responsibility since it concerns the preservation of the Corps legacy;
- c. Chief Warrant Officer Thompson asked if there was a reminder notice forwarded to Reserve members advising them of the pending expiration of their membership. Captain Dzeoba advised that there are several features of the MMS 365 system that need to be confirmed as fully operational. He further encouraged the attendees to continue to advise members that their personal email addresses need to be added to their MMS 365 account;
- d. Chief Warrant Officer Saunders commented on the situation with the Ferret being a RCEME holding. Captain Dzeoba advised that this item has an appraised value of \$18,000 and is presently listed as one of RCEME's heritage assets. It was secured as a bargaining chip to be used for obtaining additional items, such as Jiffy Jeeps;
- e. Lieutenant-Colonel Raymond advised that the structures for the potential RCEME Guild Annual Report are being sought and will either be a standalone report or a one slide presentation. This will also be part of the agenda at the spring meeting. Colonel Corriveau wants to ensure that all members have access to this information;
- f. Lieutenant-Colonel Raymond further noted that there is a need to reduce the amount of traffic that is directed to the Corps Adjutant's office. A plan will be developed where the RCEME Council regional representatives actively take part in directing concerns and matters of interest from members to the BOD and to the Corps Adjutant's office;
- g. the discussion regarding Board members serving a maximum of two years has not been tracked in the past. Terms for members may be extended, however, but must stay within the guidelines of the Constitution. Lieutenant-Colonel Raymond will address this at the spring 2019 BOD meeting;
- in addition to the approved Constitution changes that have been made, Lieutenant-Colonel Raymond suggested that some of the language could be more flexible so that continuous updates to the wording will not be necessary; and
- Brigadier-General (Retired) Brewer proposed that Major Wade Sett continue his service as the Reserve Representative on the RCEME Guild BOD. Major Sett accepted.

37. <u>Closing Remarks</u> . Colonel Corriveau thanked all the members for attending, and recognized the efforts being made by all to serve the members of the	Chairman
Guild.	
38. Adjournment. The next BOD meeting will be held in the spring of 2019, date to be determined.

- There has been a 1-2% inflation cost built into the budget with respect to purchases and expenses such as accourrements, loyalty coins, Jiffy Jeep maintenance etc.
- 2) Interest on the NPP account received monthly is approximately \$350.00.
- CANEX continues to return 10% of the value of all RCEME merchandise sold into the NPP portfolio.
- With respect to expenses, the actual cost of accourtements of \$7,353.04 so far is over the budgeted figure of \$6,000, however, it reflects the purchase of an additional 300 new membership coins. Captain Dzeoba reminded members that mailing costs for anniversary pins, loyalty coins, etc. are also included in the expense figures.






