Captain Denis Milot will retire on September 6, 2019, after 32 years of service in the Canadian Armed Forces and the RCEME Corps.

Captain Denis Milot is from Trois-Rivieres, Quebec. He joined the Canadian Forces in August 1987. After completing basic training, language training, he completed his RCEME officer course in late 1989.

His first assignment was at CFEMES from 1990 to 1991, where he was responsible for the common QL3 training program for artisans. In July 1991, he was transferred to Canadian Forces Base (CFB) Montreal - St-Hubert Garrison, where he was responsible for the vehicle group of the base's maintenance section, supporting over 900 vehicles, supported by some 50 military and civilian mechanics.

In July 1993, Capt Milot was transferred again, this time to the 202nd Canadian Forces Workshop Depot until 2001. During his time there, he will implement a project management procedure, manage the Leopard 1 refurbish project, coordinate a project to implement autonomous work teams, manage the Human Resources and Organization component of the MASIS pilot project (now DRMIS) and finally, act as a member of the bid team for a highly efficient organization as part of the Alternative Service Delivery program.

In July 2001, he joined Land Force Quebec Area Headquarters (LFQA) in the G4 branch where he held the positions of G4 Maintenance, G4 Operations, and G4 Plans. He coordinated the implementation of the maintenance and procurement modules of SIGRD within the Area. In September 2007, Captain Milot transferred to the Primary Reserves, then moving to class B position in the G4 branch. In February 2014, he was transferred to the G3 branch in the function of G34 plans. He was appointed interim G34 in October 2017 and continued in this position until today.

Capt Milot graduated from École Polytechnique de Montréal with a Bachelor's degree in Mechanical Engineering (Design and Production); class of 1986.

Denis and his wife Monique will settle in the magnificent Laurentians region where they will oversee the construction project of their new house. They will be happy to welcome children and grandchildren.

A departure with dignity ceremony will take place on Thursday, September 5, 2019 at 11:30 a.m. in Room 104 of the Officers, Warrant Officers and Sergeants Mess at the Montreal Garrison (Longue-Pointe), Building 154.
