During his time as a Vehicle Technician, Glyn worked in 80% of the shops in Gagetown and was quick to grasp DRMIS when it was introduced in 2009. His experience with LEMS made him a valuable member of the Defence Team when on 31 May 2011 he started as a Workshop System Administrator for the Maintenance Company Control Office in Gagetown. Over the years Glyn has organized many RCEME events which cultivated esprits de corps. After 8 years as a Public Service Employee, he has decided to retire but continues to serve the RCEME Corps as Vice President of the Gagetown LAD.
