Cpl Jason Boutilier

After 9 years of loyal service in the Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) and the Royal Electrical Mechanical Engineers (RCEME) Cpl Boutilier has retired on 5 May 2020. Born in Sydney, N.S. Cpl Jason Boutilier joined the Canadian Armed Forces on May 5th 2011, soon after finishing Basic he went off to North Bay to enrol in the Sault College of Applied Motive Power Technician program. Upon completion of his QL3 he was posted to 1 Svc Bn CFB Edmonton A.B. where he completed his OJT program. In March 2016 after completing his QL5's he was posted back to 1 Svc Bn. Shortly after his return to Edmonton he was then posted to LdSH (RC) on 5 April 2016, he completed his LEO2 Maintenance course in June 2017 and was moved to a Sabre Sqn shortly after. During his time in Edmonton Cpl Boutilier has deployed on multiple Op Lentus operations and many Maple Resolve Exercises. The most memorable one was Op Lentus 18-03 (B.C. Floods) where he received a Joint Task Force Certificate of Achievement and the Commanders coin for his success with the recovery of 90% of the vehicle casualties along the route of the operation area. He demonstrated the highest standards of teamwork and commitment to duty. After 9 years of service Cpl Boutilier will be releasing from the CAF. Jason plans on staying in the local area to repair heavy equipment and partner with a local shop and repair trucks on the side.
